# GCSE results testament to pupils' hard work

Pupils sat a combination of the newly reformed GCSEs (graded 1-9) and iGCSEs.

8% of all grades were at grade 9, the highest possible and most challenging grade to achieve. Overall, 37% of grades across all the GCSEs sat were at A\*-A or 9-7. An incredible 94% of all grades were at A\*-C (or 9-4 in the new currency).

The success of a school cannot be measured in results alone, it is also about the pupils' experiences, the breadth of opportunity and the friendships formed.

Yushi achieved nine 9 grades and three 7s, he said:

*"I have enjoyed my time at Lincoln Minster, the school is very friendly. I want to study Natural Sciences at university. I would like to be a Bio-Chemist"*



## Hugely successful year for A Level exams

Once again, Upper Sixth leavers had a hugely successful year with their A Level results.

Nearly a quarter of all grades were at A\*/A with 62% of grades at A\*-B. An outstanding 84% were graded A\* to C. These excellent results reflect the hard work and commitment of a wonderful year group who threw themselves into all that Lincoln Minster School has to offer.

As ever, the most important thing to celebrate is not the overall headline figures, but the individual successes behind them and the journeys and outcomes that these grades enable. Our pupils will move on to a wide variety of different settings – some to highly competitive school leaver programmes at Marks and Spencer and Aldi, others going to Russell Group universities such as Leeds, Loughborough and Birmingham, and a whole range of diverse courses from Chemical Engineering to Photography to Architecture. 91% of the year group achieved their first choice destination. We are proud of them all.
